Sharing a School with the Community



Brush Prairie residents are on top of education trends with their new 100,000 SF high school designed with not just growth in mind, but also community involvement. The facility's classrooms will accommodate the town's 850 students, but the common areas where community activities take place are built for a capacity of 1,300.

As the student population increases, the building can be easily expanded by constructing another classroom wing. Meanwhile, a multipurpose community room with a performance platform and fold-out auditorium seating is perfect for plays and musical performances. The gymnasium has a seating capacity of 1,400 and also houses an indoor running track.

Interface Engineering contributed their engineering expertise with HVAC and plumbing design services, as well as energy life-cycle cost analysis.

Working in concert with LSW Architects, Interface Principal Andy Frichtl noted how well the project went: "Within budget, on time... a flawless job".
